Check eligibility

People receiving benefits including Universal Credit & Pension Credit may be able to get a cheaper broadband plan called a social tariff. These work the same way as standard packages, but at a lower monthly price.

Contact your provider

If you already have broadband, ask your provider if they offer a social tariff. Switching is normally free, you don't need to start a new contract, and the price will stay the same for the term.







Use a social tariff comparison tool

Very few social tariffs appear on broadband comparison websites. FasterBroadband's free comparison service checks if your current provider has a social tariff, and if not, lists other providers who can help.

Compare costs and options

Full fibre social tariffs start from £12.50 a month, with prices fixed for the whole contract. You can leave at any time without penalty. Discounted mobile data plans are also available from £10 a month.
